Rector's Ramblings

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

This week our Adult Formation conversation was on Confirmation.

The old joke goes, "How do you get rid of bats in the belfry?" "Confirm them, and you will never see them again."

The joke works because it is true on many levels. In our Church, Confirmation has become a simple rite of passage that youth go through because it is expected. This is not a good enough reason.

Sometimes, Confirmation is (halfjokingly) referred to as making one an Episcopalian and allowing you to serve on the MLT and Diocesan Leadership.

So, what is Confirmation?

Baptism and Chrismation (marking with the Holy Oil) makes us citizens of the kingdom of God. We are born again in Baptism and are spiritual infants called to grow into the full stature of Christ. Confirmation marks that time when we make our mature confession of faith, and become full participants in the Church Militant for the service of God and the Kingdom.

The grace of Confirmation is that it refreshes us in the gifts of the Holy Spirit given at Baptism for that life of service. It does not make one an Anglican, or in the US an Episcopalian, it makes one an adult Christian united to the Church catholic through the laying on of hands, and made ready to stand up and serve. Outreach Opportunities for May and June - St. Vincent de Paul

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, an international organization, has been in Bloomington for over 50 years. Its mission is "to seek and find the forgotten, suffering and the deprived." It is maintained entirely by volunteers. This past year they served around 1000 households a month.

Specifically, the following supplies are needed:

- Canned foods, especially those with protein as peanut butter and tuna fish
- Vegetables of all kinds
- Boxed foods as rice and varieties of rice and beans
- Macaroni and cheese
- Instant oatmeal
- Dry cereals
- Drinks as Gatorade and water
- Baby diapers and wet wipes

Please place supplies in the baskets in the Narthex and in the hallway by the fireplace. If you prefer to give money, make your check out to St. Matthew's and in the memo line write "outreach.' Place these in the plate offering, not the baskets.
