Rector's Ramblings

Rattles, Snakes, and Patrick.

You might have noticed a weird sound during the liturgy on Ash Wednesday and last Sunday. That sound is the sound of a crotalus (from the Latin transliteration of the Greek for "rattle"). A crotalus can take different forms from a true rattle, to castanets, to a clapper, to two sticks being banged together. It was traditionally used during the Triduum (the three days before Easter) in lieu of the altar bells. The purpose was to mark the same events as the bells, but with a more somber sound.

At St. Matthew's, during Lent, bells are not usually used and so the crotalus makes its appearance early. Like the Altar Bells it serves to communicate a simple message, "pay attention, important things are happening".

Of course, there is another crotalus out there. It is a type of rattlesnake found in the Western Hemisphere from southern Canada to southern Uruguay.

We do not have one of these.

Chrism Mass

The annual Chrism Mass and the renewal of ordination vows will be held at St. Paul's Cathedral at 10AM on April 13th. The oils used at Baptism and the Anointing of the Sick for the next or any of their relatives? The Irish.

During his vigilant study, he again experienced the call to return to those who had abused him and bring the Faith to the Irish people. He obeyed, and the rest is history.

On our trip to Ireland, Amy and I, found a statue of Patrick standing on the top of the old motte and bailey in Granard. We could see it from over a mile away standing vigil over the village. It was a wonderful find, so we stopped and climbed the hill as part of our pilgrimage. Our vigilance in observing the scenery paid off with a wonderful experience. year are also blessed at this service. This is an important moment in our mutual life as a Diocese, and all are invited to attend. If you would like to attend please let one of the clergy know and we will arrange carpooling.

Hymns: # Old Testament Genesis 15:1-12,17-18

The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat

three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.
