"How do you discern?"

I was asked this last weekend, and it is an appropriate question. Discernment is first a function of a solid prayer life. Without a regular, and consistent, prayer life discernment is impossible as it becomes an emotional activity rather than a spiritual work.

If we are in prayer regularly, I have found the following advice from an old friend to be incredibly useful. It is not a guarantee but a guide. 1. Has God given you a scripture that affirms a sense of call? If so, it will leap off the page and not leave your mind and heart. This is not mining the scriptures for what we want, but a prayerful reading of scripture in the course of our regular pattern. For Amy and me it was the lectionary at Morning Prayer in the same passage on the same day.

2. Are doors opening, or are you forcing them open? If you have to push, it is probably not the will of God for you. For us, the doors opened to simply walk through. This included Amy having a full-time position before I was asked to affirm the call.

3. Is the Holy Spirit prompting? This can be the most difficult of the three, as you need to make sure it is the prompting of the Holy Spirit and not indigestion, or emotion, or desire. The Holy Spirit's prompting will always line up with scripture and prayer, and is discerned through conversations with a spiritual director or spiritual friend. In the case of accepting a new call, there were, and are, tremendous moments of prompting by the Holy Spirit affirming the call, and each time we spent more time in prayer, and discussion with our spiritual directors. In the end if all three line up, you can take great comfort that you are walking the path God wants for you.

Other questions were asked about Amy's and Liam's futures.

Continuing Worship Guidance

St. Matthew's is authorized to have 40 individuals present at any given service.

With this new information we will be returning to our regular, or normal, schedule Sunday morning. There is no need to make reservations for these services.

For the near future, coffee hour must take place outside, and is tough to plan on short notice. A short fellowship time will take place outside following the service.

The guidance regarding masking and singing (below) still holds.

- 1. All are reminded to take their own health issues into consideration when deciding whether to attend. Also, stay home if you have any symptoms that are not associated with a chronic health issue.
- 2. Most services will be spoken/read services. A cantor is allowed to sing, but congregants are asked to refrain.
- 3. All individuals who are in the building must maintain physical distance and have a face covering, unless actively leading a portion of the service.
- 4. Each service will have color coded seats in the Nave. Families are allowed to sit together.
- 5. Only the restrooms in the addition will be available for use.
- 6. The 10AM service will continue to be streamed "live" on Facebook. If you are uncomfortable being in the worship space and still wish to commune, communion will still be available via the "drive-through" for 30 minutes after the service. It is expected that "drive-through" communion will not continued to be offered after the 28 of June.
